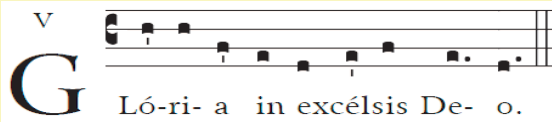

### STUDENT CLASSES
