The word "Lent" comes from the Old English "lencten," meaning "springtime". The seasons lasts from Ash Wednesday to the Vespers of Holy Saturday -- forty days, never minindg the six Sundays which don't count as "Lent" liturgically. The Latin name for Lent, "Quadragesima", means forty and refers to the forty days Christ spent in the desert which is the origin of the Season. The last two weeks of Lent were traditionally known as "Passiontide," consisting of Passion Week and Holy Week. The last three days of Holy Week -- Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday we still call the "Sacred Triduum."

Lent is a particularly good time to make amends and rebuild broken relationships. Pray for the ability to truly forgive the repentant who've wronged us, and consider those whom we have wronged and whose forgiveness we should seek.

Lord, make our hearts contrite and humble. Give us fortitude to make right what we have done wrong. Have mercy on us, Lord!
